Mark 1:42 And as soon as he had spoken, immediately the leprosy departed from him, and he was cleansed.

Luke 5:12 And it came to pass, when he was in a certain city, behold a man full of leprosy: who seeing Jesus fell on [his] face, and besought him, saying, Lord, if you wilt, you canst make me clean.

Luke 5:13 And he put forth [his] hand, and touched him, saying, I will: be you clean. And immediately the leprosy departed from him.
